

Any person who desires to object to the entry of their name or that of any other person upon the said roll or to the assessed value placed upon any property must by August 14, 2019, lodge their compliant(s) in writing to the Chief Administrative Officer of Smoky Lake County.

Why Magnesium Chloride (MG-30)?

Ever wonder why Magnesium Chloride (MG-30) is used on Smoky Lake County roads and not calcium chloride? Simply put, it's less corrosive. Below are results from RAE Engineering, who tested corrosion rates on steel;

Summary of average corrosion rates measured with electrochemisty method			
	Rain Water	Magnesium Chloride (MG-30)	29% Calcium Chloride
Corrosion Rate (mm/year)	0.112	0.0618	0.3346

AGRICULTURAL SERVICES PEST MONITORING

Bertha Armyworm traps are being monitored at selected locations since June and have seen an increase in population. Although widespread infestations are unlikely, farmers should continue to inspect their crops for evidence of the pests. The Bertha Armyworm

monitoring will continue until early August. Swede Midge traps are being monitored as well in

select canola fields for Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada and those findings will be reported in the fall.
