Policy Statement No. 02-05-03: Fire Permit Agreement

Purpose:	To facilitate fire control.	

Policy Statement and Guidelines:

The permit holder has full responsibility and liability with regards to controlling the fire and any loss or damage resulting from the lighting of the fire. This means that the permit holder must ensure proper fireguards are in place, support equipment is on hand and that all necessary precautions are taken. Extinguishing the fire within the time period allotted is also the responsibility of the fire permit holder.

Recovery of Firefighting Costs: In accordance with Bylaw: Fire Protection Services, as amended from time to time or any costs incurred by the County Fire departments will be charged to the landowner, if the Fire Department or County is called upon to respond or extinguish a fire. Additional charges may be pending under the *Forest and Prairie Protection Act* or if the landowner or occupant does not have a Fire Permit.

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Policy Statement and Guidelines:

Burning shall be done in compliance with the Forest and Prairie Protection Act and regulations made there under:

- 1. Burn in accordance with the terms on the reverse side of the permit.
- 2. No burning when winds are over 15 km ph (10 mph).
- 3. The fire must be completely extinguished when the permit expires.
- In the case, that smoke would cause a hazard to visibility while burning.
 "Smoke Signs" must be posted. Therefore, before lighting the fire, permit holder must contact Carillion at 656-3638, if burning near a Highway and contact the County Office at 656-3730 or the Public Works Shop at 656-3755, if burning near a maintained County Road.
- 5. Alberta One-Call (1-800-242-3447) must be completed prior to lighting the

NOTE: THIS PERMIT IS NOT VALID UNLESS COUNTERSIGNED AND MAY BE CANCELLED AT ANY TIME.

CONDITIONS:

Any person lighting a fire must have a valid Fire Permit issued by Smoky Lake County. Fire Permits are required year round and can only be obtained and approved by a Fire Guardian. Exceptions:

Attended outdoors or contained campfire, which has been lit for cooking or warming purpose.

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Policy Statement and Guidelines:

Incinerator fire - fire contained within a non-combustible structure, container or barrel with openings covered by heavy gauge metal screen having a mesh size not larger than 13 millimeters (1/2) and which are for the purpose of burning refuse, protecting livestock from insect or for protecting garden plants from frost.

ALL APPROVED FIRES BY PERMIT OR EXCEPTION, ARE SUBJECT TO PROVINCIAL OR LOCAL FIRE BANS, DECLARED UPON THREAT OF A FIRE HAZARD TO THE CITIZENS WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF SMOKY LAKE COUNTY.

EXCERPT FROM THE

FOREST AND PRAIRIE PROTECTION ACT OF ALBERTA RSA 2000
Section 19 (3) A Fire Permit is valid only for the period for which it is issued.

> (4) A Forest Officer or Fire Guardian issuing a Fire Permit may endorse on the permit any special fire control conditions with which the applicant must comply in addition to the provisions of this Act and the regulations.

A Fire Permit may be suspended or cancelled at any time by a Forest Officer or Fire Guardian and on Section 20 receiving notice of the suspension or cancellation, the person concerned shall immediately extinguish any

fire set pursuant to the person's permit.

(1) For the purpose of fire control the Minister may, by Section 21 order: a. suspend or cancel within any part or all of Alberta all fire permits, or b. prohibit the lighting or require the extinguishing of a fire set other than under the authority of a Fire Permit.

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Policy Statement and Guidelines: Section 21 (2) The order made pursuant to subsection (1) shall be immediately published at least the twice a day for not less than 2 consecutive days by the radio and television stations that are considered by the Minister most likely to

occupied or owned by person.


bring the matter to the attention of the public. (3) In an area affected by an order made pursuant to subsection (1), every person shall immediately proceed to extinguish every open outdoor fire lit by person or under the person's authority and every fire located on land

Section 22 No person shall:

- (a) Light an outdoor fire without first taking sufficient precautions to ensure that the fire can be kept under control at all times.
- (b) Light an outdoor fire when any fire hazard or burning hazard is conducive to a fire readily escaping out of control.
- (c) Fail to take reasonable steps to control a fire for the purpose of preventing it from spreading onto land other than person's own.
- (d) Deposit, discard or leave any burning matter or substance in a place where it might ignite other matter and result in a fire, or,
- (e) Conduct in a forest protection area any activity that involves the use of fire or that might reasonably be expected to cause a fire, unless the person exercises reasonable care to prevent a fire from occurring.

Every person who sets a fire under authority of a permit shall:

- a. Keep the permit at the site of the fire.
- b. Produce and show the permit to an officer on request



Policy 02-M-04-01: Fire Permit Best Practices

That Smoky Lake County acknowledge the proposed changes to Smoky Lake County Fire and Rescue Policy 02-M-04-01: Fire Permits Best Practices, as follows:





Schedule "A" Best Practices for Issuing Fire Permits



ration of Permits
o permits may be issued for a period of fourteen Fire permits may be issued for a period of formal (14) days. The fire guardian may extend a fire permit beyond the fourteen (14) day period upon inspection and special conditions must be given to complete a safe burn.

Brush Piles
Brush Piles are restricted to a 15 m diameter with
30 m between piles. Older piles in the form of
windrows are subject to inspection and must have
special permission from Smoky Lake County.

Permit holder must be the landowner or a
renter.

- renter.

 Permit holder or responsible renter must monitor the fire(s)-and is responsible until the fire is extinguished. March through April Smoky Lake County may inspect your burn sites with a thermal imaging eamera checking for hot spots and improperly extinguished burns. These inspections will be used to reduce the risk of spring fires.

 Permit holder or responsible renter must obtain an Alberta One Call clearance on all buried utilities prior to lighting.

- hrs.
 When there is an adequate snow cover of 6", monitor every 8hrs.
 When there is neighboring trees or buildings, monitor every hour.

Fire Guard and Snow Cover

- A minimum 15 m fire guard is required and must be worked until soil cover is black unless there is adequate snow cover.
- Adequate snow cover is a minimum six (6") inches which could withstand some melting and drying while fire is burning

- Up to six (6) brush piles may be burned at a time within a distance of one half mile.
- No burning on muskeg or peat land.
- No Burning below -25°C or when the temperature inversion is forecasted to be 15 degrees or greater.
- No burning when winds are over 15 km ph (10 mph).

- No person shall:

 Light an outdoor fire without first taking sufficient precautions to ensure that the fire can be kept under control at all times.
 Light an outdoor fire when any fire hazard or burning hazard is conducive to a fire readily escaping out of control.
 Fail to take reasonable steps to control a fire for the purpose of preventing it from spreading onto land other than person's own.
- Deposit, discard or leave any burning matter or substance in a place where it might ignite other matter and result in a fire, or,
 Conduct in a forest protection area any activity that involves the use of fire or that might reasonably be expected to cause a fire, unless the person exercises reasonable care to prevent a fire from occurring.

- Responsibility

 Permit holder is responsible for the care, control and extinguishment of the fire.

 The burning permit must be available on request along with the permit holder or responsible renter to supervise the burn.

 Permit holders are no longer required to phone the fire department before starting a burn but must contact Bonnyville Regional Fire Authority and fulfill all other permit requirements.

 Permit holders are responsible for reading and adhering to the conditions and
 - regulations.

 In the case, that smoke would cause a hazard to visibility while burning.

 "Smoke Signs" must be posted.

 Therefore, before lighting the fire, permit holder must contact Carillion at 656-3638,
 - if burning near a Highway and contact the County Office at 656-3730 or the Public Works Shop at 656-3755, if burning near a County Road.

Remember: YOU will be responsible for all costs associated with fires resulting from violation of these guidelines or poor burning practices, in accordance with Smoky Lake County Bylaw.
