1.0 Opening

- 1.1 Reeve Craig Lukinuk declared the Public Hearing open at 9:20 a.m. The Reeve stated he will Chair the Public Hearing and welcomed all persons in attendance to the Public Hearing.
- 1.2 Reeve at this time asked the Chief Administrative Officer to confirm that the Public Hearing has been advertised and notice has been provided in accordance with the applicable legislation.

Chief Administrative Officer replied:

Proposed County **Bylaw No. 1300-17:** Cancellation of Undeveloped Government Road Allowance – Adjacent to Plan 1423033, Block 1, Lot 2 (19473 Victoria Trail), has been advertised and notice has been provided in accordance with Section 606 of the *Municipal Government Act, R.S.A. 2000*.

Specifically, Sec 606(2) which states:

Notice of the bylaw, resolution, meeting, public hearing or other thing must be:

- (a) published at least once a week for 2 consecutive weeks in at least one newspaper or other publication circulating in the area to which the proposed bylaw, resolution or other thing relates, or in which the meeting or hearing is to be held, **or**
- (b) mailed or delivered to every residence in the area to which the proposed bylaw, resolution or other thing relates, or in which the meeting or hearing is to be held.
- **1.3** The purpose of this Hearing is for the Council of Smoky Lake County to obtain **public input**, in favour and opposed to proposed County **Bylaw No. 1300-17**, Cancellation of Undeveloped Government Road Allowance Adjacent to Plan 1423033, Block 1, Lot 2 (19473 Victoria Trail).

Background:


- Bylaw 1300-17 was presented for 1st Reading on February 16, 2017.
- Notice of the proposed Bylaw was mailed to adjacent landowners on **February 27, 2017.**
- Notice of the proposed Bylaw was circulated to affected agencies for comment on March 6, 2017.
- A notice has also been posted on the County's website since March 6, 2017.
- The Public Hearing Notices were advertised in the Smoky Lake Signal and March 6, 2017 and March 13, 2017. The proposed Bylaw was advertised and Notice has been provided in accordance with the applicable legislation.
- This hearing has been scheduled to obtain public input on proposed Bylaw in accordance with Section 230 of the Municipal Government Act.
- **1.4** The Reeve outlined the ground rules and the order of speaking will be:

The ground rules of the hearing and the order of speaking will be:

- a) the planner and/or planning staff will speak first to outline facts and present their recommendation on the proposed Bylaw;
- b) members of the public, who have signed in, will be given the opportunity to speak in the order they signed in, starting with those opposed to the Bylaw, followed by those who support the Bylaw;
- c) anyone else, who did not sign in will be given the opportunity to speak;
- d) the planner and/or planning staff will be given the opportunity to present closing remarks or address any of the issues or concerns presented;
- e) Councillors will be given the opportunity to ask questions;
- f) Only Councillors may ask questions of speakers during the Hearing. If any persons wish to ask questions of a speaker, they must ask Council to ask the question on their behalf during their presentation, and Council will only ask the question of a Councillor wishes to have an answer;
- g) Council will then end the Hearing and consider the information received during the Hearing;
- h) Council will consider the representations made regarding the Bylaw and any other matter Council considers appropriate.

4.0 Public Presentations at the Public Hearing

4.1 Against:

- Member of the General Public, Gene Chomik, Smoky Lake County Tax Payer:
 - I am an adjacent landowner and have submitted a letter (see above).
 - As far as the debris on the location, there is none.
 - He does not need that land, some of the stakes, I believe, are on my property.
- Member of the General Public, Maurice Chomik, Smoky Lake County Tax Payer:
 - I am speaking on behalf of Jean Chomik.
 - I agree that his request far exceeds his requirements.

■ Member of the General Public, Bill Sadoway, Smoky Lake County Tax Payer:

North Saskatchewan River Elbow

This point on the North Saskatchewan River has been referred to as the elbow for hundreds of years. The elbow is arguably the most scenic point on the North Saskatchewan River's journey to lake Winnipeg. It is the most northerly point on its trip eastward. This point has always been a place to stop and rest. A place to enjoy what mother nature has so lavishly given us. A place where we can relax, meditate and capture its beauty with our cameras. Its always been a stopping place on journeys on the Victoria Trail- Albertas first highway that is still in use.

The elbow has a big problem. A problem that never should have been allowed to happen. The elbow has been bruised which has developed into a nasty growth. This growth has to be arrested before it becomes malignant.

We have today a very serious dilemma . We are being asked to approve the closure of the unused portion of a county road allowance that provides access to what's left of the best viewing point of the clbow. Firstly, I would argue that unused is incorrect. Secondly, it would be used a lot more with free access to the site.

This road allowance belongs to the residents of this county and this Province. Morally or ethically, this property should not be given away- not one square foot. We must try and look at least 20 generations into the future when we contemplate these decisions and their affects. We should make efforts to increase access to the elbow, not restrict it.

To conclude, this is not just to preserve a spot to take photos. This is a place of immense historical significance. Archaeologists have identified along the trail camp sites dating back 6000 years. Its not hard to imagine how many peoples have visited and rested and enjoyed this place of beauty.

To refresh your high school social studies lessons, Sir Sandford Fleming, surveyor, civil engineer and scientist was commissioned to explore a possible route to the Pacific ocean for the Grand Trunk Railway.

The book "Ocean to Ocean" published in 1873, describes his expedition through Canada in 1872. He describes his weekend stay at Fort Victoria in detail. When he left for Fort Edmonton, guess where one of his stops was.

Jordan Ruegg, Planning and Development Manager:

- To clarify, before the road could be closed, the bylaw would need to be approved by the Minister of Transportation, and any written public submissions would be included with the bylaw when it is sent to the Minister.
- The bottom of the blue proposed road allowance closure area of the map follows the cliff bank as surveyed, and is simply joined with a line going straight north and south.

Ron Bobocel, Councillor Division No. 2:

• To address the concerns of blocking public access to the "River Elbow" or "Lover's Point": the County cannot erect a sign stating public access through private land because it would not be proper or lawful; even if Jean Chomik gives the County permission to do so.

Cary Smigerowsky, Councillor Division No. 4:

• Further to Councillor Bobocel's response: the county cannot put up a sign on private property due to liability issues; only the landowner could do so.
