

### **Policy Statement and Guidelines:**

2.7 The program will only be carried out **subject to available funds**.

#### 3. PROCEDURE:

- 3.1 **Schedule "A" Beaver Management Form** will be completed and kept as a record of verification.
- 3.2 Upon verification, a <u>service fee</u> of **FIFTEEN DOLLARS (\$15.00)** will be paid for each verifiable beaver removed only from the problem area to the trapper or landowner.
- 3.3 No service fee will be paid without the consent of the Agricultural Service Board for landowners/leasors or trappers, who submit claim without first notifying the Agricultural Fieldman, that there is a flooding problem on agricultural land and this problem has been verified by the Agricultural Fieldman, prior to any trapping being done.
- 3.4 Only whole beaver tails will be accepted. The tails must be easily identifiable by Smoky lake County employees accepting the tails. If the tails are not to these standards they will not be accepted and no service fee will be paid to applicant.
- 3.5 Beaver carcasses will be removed and disposed of in an appropriate manner by the program participant.
- 3.6 The program participant is responsible to take into consideration the characteristic of the site and consequences of the control work.
- 3.7 If any abuse of the program is found, the applicant will be banned from participating.



Goal:

To implement an integrated vegetation management program on municipal right-of-ways for the purpose of reducing noxious weeds and ensuring sightlines are clear for the motoring public.



-Swede Midge is monitored on behalf of Agri-food Canada. It is an 8 week program where sticky pads are changed weekly. 


