TOPIC

Management Policy Statement No. M01-45-01: Animal Control Technician

PROPOSAL

Background:

Beginning in the early 2000's the County had an independent contractor who installed and maintained flow devices and trapped beavers on an as needed basis; and up until 2015, employed a full-time seasonal trapper for the purpose of trapping problem beavers within County right-of-ways.

In 2015 the County hired a contract trapper at a cost of \$21,000 per year to trap during the spring and fall. Since this time there has been an influx of beaver population due to severely wet years and inability to meet the beaver control demands.

In 2017, a full-time, seasonal Trapper was hired.

Current:

Additional workload:

- Policy changes were made at both the Federal and Provincial levels affecting blasting regulations.
- The Department of Fisheries and Oceans (DFO) now requires a Request for Review for any blasting activity that is going to take place, and it must take place from July 15th-November 1st.
- If the County chooses to remove a dam via hand methods, or equipment then a Notification Form is required to be filled out and sent into the DFO.
- Additionally, any trapping required on Crown Land should be done during the trapping season which begins October 1st June 1st North of Hwy 28 and begins October 15th-May 15th South of Hwy 28, as per the Biologist in Athabasca who is responsible for our zone.
- Since the retirement of our Peace Officer, County Dog Catching has been assigned to the Animal Control Technician and dog catching services need to be year-round.

Proposal:

A job description Policy for the Animal Control Technician had not been created prior to this. Management is proposing the Animal Control Technician job description be based on a fulltime year-round position as it would be a benefit to the County for the following reasons:

- All DFO requirements could be met during winter months for blasting preapprovals as well as the Alberta Environment and Parks (AEP) requirement for all Crown Land trapping to take place in the winter months.
- Problem areas could be prevented before the Spring thaw occurs through proactive measures in winter months.
- Dog catching services would consistent.
- A year-round proactive beaver management plan could be developed to mitigate flood damages to the County's infrastructure.
